### Churches, Channels of Hope Programme

It has been a long and rich history since the first CCoH Facilitator Training was piloted in 2002 and over the years God has used both the content and the experience of this training to transform and empower faith leaders and strengthen their ministries.

In 2021 we were privileged that the partnership with Diaconia offered the opportunity to facilitate the training twice, once in the Western Cape and once in the Eastern Cape. Cumulatively CABSA has offered 58 facilitator trainings over the past 20 years.

This training offers a comprehensive perspective on HIV, not only as a public health challenge concerned with the management and prevention of the disease, it also emphasize the important potential and responsibility of faith leaders to be channels of hope amidst the pandemic.

# HIV Farm Project and Peer Educators



"Our peers have become a network of support to one another. It is refreshing to see how they care for and support each other even outside of CABSA programming." Clive Swartz, Project Facilitator.

In 2021 CABSA focused our efforts on the mentoring and follow-up of the existing active peer educators from two farming communities, Wellington and De Doorns, both in the Western Cape. Nine mentor and follow-up meetings for trained peer educators were offered and individual pastoral follow-up visits when needed. One Refresher workshop was presented in each town with a specific focus on COVID-19 vaccine literacy and readiness.

Peer Educators were encouraged and supported to plan and implement community health interventions. Twelve events were organised and implemented in De Doorns and eight in Wellington. In total 683 community members participated and benefited from these community events.

Peer educators were blessed with a Bible donation from Helderberg Uitreik and surprised with facilitator and storyteller, Themba Lonzi's who helped us to reflect and debrief on the year while expressing ourselves through the rhythms of Dembe drums.

CABSA is deeply grateful for the ongoing partnership and support of the CHABAHIVA Trust and the Otto Per Mille of the Waldensian Church, who makes the HIV Farm Project Possible.







# Hope & Support Project

"I'm turning 50 this year and will be HIV positive for 23 years and a priest for 7 years. I have survived colon cancer 3 times. Our God is faithful." Hope & Support Member

This project was launched in the first few months of the COVID-19 pandemic with the explicit focus of offering spiritual and emotional support to CABSA facilitators and peer educators who are living openly with HIV.

Facilitators and peer educators who disclosed their status privately receive support on an individual base.

The Hope&Support offers people living with HIV the platform to stay connected, share prayer requests, joys, fears and challenges.

CABSA is most grateful to our first two BackaBuddy volunteers who raised money to support this project.

Anneke Boshoff raised money for both the HIV Farm and the Hope&Support Project with her Extreme Cold Water Swim Challenge. She braced the cold Atlantic in the Cape Town winter and swam 12km.

Cloetie Fourie raised for the Hope&Support Project with her Greeting Card marathon that raised funds from BackaBuddy supporters and created revenue as CABSA are selling the cards for additional revenue.

# Covid-19 Vaccine Workshops

Across the globe, the arrival of COVID-19 vaccinations was met with mixed feelings, with people having to navigate through deliberate misinformation and dissent that was often also perpetuated by faith leaders and people of faith.





In this context CABSA was deeply grateful for the initiative of World Vision International,

license partner of CABSA, who developed a Churches, Channels of Hope COVID-19 vaccines workshop curriculum and for CHABAHIVA Trust who were willing to partner with CABSA in the implementation of these workshops.

"My highlight was the reminder of the importance of dialogue, sharing ideas and opinions as well as listening to understand each other. Life is hard enough as it is without making it harder to discuss in the safe environment of faith-based communities."

Eleven Churches, Channels of Hope COVID-19 Vaccine Workshops were facilitated, five online and six in person, equipping 158 faith and community leaders. Workshops were conducted in three different provinces of South Africa: Eastern Cape, Gauteng and Western Cape. Online workshops were attended by participants from Zimbabwe, Kenya, Nigeria, Mozambique, Zambia and Rwanda.









# Gender, Advocacy and Youth

#### **Youth Peer Educators**

CABSA was excited to host our first Youth Peer Educator Training since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic. The training was offered in Cape Town for youth leaders from the Lutheran Community of Southern Africa (LUCSA).



#### **GERI Training**

CABSA was privileged to be accepted into the Gender Equity & Restitution (GERI) facilitator programme, a four module programme that strengthened and stretches our gendered understanding and experiences with a diverse group of participants. The training was presented by Genderworks.



#### **Thursdays in Black**

CABSA continues to support and promote the Thursdays in Black campaign towards a world without rape and violence.











### Collaboration & Networking













CABSA firmly believes in the necessity and importance of networking and collaboration. The Covid-19 pandemic created new platforms to work together and to learn more from one another.

To facilitate such cooperation CABSA:

- Belong to local, national, and regional networking organisations
- Informally and spontaneously collaborate with partner organisations whenever opportunities present itself
